Without skipping a beat, the museum staff took a short break from Polar and quickly resumed the day to day activities that include exhibits, Harborside Express Train Rides, educational programs, and preparing for the year ahead. What a year we have planned! The Young Ingenuity Program invites all students interested in mechanics, electrical projects and technology, to meet for orientation and registration in the mentor driven program, Saturday, February 28, 11 am – 12:30 pm. Participants will be assigned a project that will later be on exhibit at the museum. All information is on the website. Educational outreach includes the museum's continued internship program with the University of Houston and TAMUG, collaborations with the Houston Museum of History & Natural Science and GISD Powerful Learning Initiative for grades Pre-K - High School. In addition, the museum's education department provides docents, sensory tours, and curriculum for autistic individuals, Home School students, Developmentally Challenged, and Senior groups.
